## Funding Method

- \* TDHCA primarily funds local organizations to provide services
  - Program participants do not apply to TDHCA directly

# Programs Specific to Persons Experiencing Homelessness or At-Risk of Homelessness

### **Emergency Solutions Grants**

#### Purpose:

ESG provides shelter and services to help persons experiencing homelessness or persons at-risk of homelessness regain housing stability.

#### \* Funding:

- TDHCA receives approximately \$8.8 million annually
- ➤ U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") Program

## Eligible ESG Uses

- 1. Street Outreach
- 2. Emergency Shelter
- 3. Homelessness Prevention
- 4. Rapid Re-housing
- 5. Homeless Management Information System
- 6. Administration\*

\*Salaries included in all activities, not just Administration.

#### 1. Street Outreach

- \* Eligible costs include, but are not limited to:
  - Locating, identifying, and building relationships with unsheltered people experiencing homelessness
  - Case Management to assess housing/service needs
  - Emergency Health Services/Mental Health Services
  - > Transportation

## 2. Emergency Shelter

- \* Eligible activities include, but are not limited to:
  - Essential Services
    - case management, child care, education, employment/training, outpatient health services, legal services, life skills training, mental health services, outpatient substance abuse treatments, transportation
  - > Shelter Operations, Renovations, Rehabilitation

# 3. Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Re-housing

- Eligible costs include, but are not limited to:
  - > Financial Assistance
    - e.g., Rental Application Fee, Security Deposits up to 2 months, Last month's rent, etc
  - \* Rental Assistance
    - Short-Term (up to 3 months)
    - Medium-Term (<3 months, up to 24 months)
    - Arrears (6 months Arrears count toward total amount of rental assistance available)

# 5. Homeless Management Info. Systems & 6. Administration

- Homeless Management Information System costs include, but are not limited to,
  - Purchasing or leasing computer hardware, equipment,
  - Purchasing software/software licenses
  - > Staff to enter data, monitor/review data quality
  - Overhead costs (e.g., office space, electricity, etc.)
- \* Administration
  - Program management, coordination, monitoring, evaluation

## Homeless Housing and Services Program Basics

#### \* Purpose:

provide for the construction, development, or procurement of housing for homeless persons; and provide local programs to prevent and eliminate homelessness

#### \* Funding:

➤ Approximately \$4.9 million annually from General Revenue

#### \* Location

Arlington, Austin, Corpus Christi, Dallas, El
 Paso, Fort Worth, Houston, and San Antonio

- \* Administration
- \* Case management
- Construction/Rehabilitation
- \* Financial Assistance
  - > Homelessness Prevention
  - ➤ Homeless Assistance
- Housing Staff
- \* Maintenance, Operation, Furnishing

# Types of Rental Housing Assistance

- Development assistance
- Individual Assistance

#### Affordable Apartments – Housing Tax Credits, Bonds, Direct Loan Programs

- \* Biggest programs are project development assistance
  - ➤ TDHCA Housing Tax Credits ("HTC")
  - > TDHCA bonds and/or low-interest direct loans
- \* Funding
  - > Approximately \$60 million per year in HTCs
  - > Approximately \$31 million per year in bonds
- Program Design
  - Low debt repayment allows units with rents restrictions to be rented to qualified families

## Affordable Apartments – TDHCA Restrictions

- \* TDHCA monitors properties
- \* Rent limits apply
- \* TDHCA properties are required to accept rental assistance
- \* Units for persons with disabilities

## Affordable Apartments – Owner Requirements

- \* Owner-determined eligibility
- \* Typical minimum qualification
- \* Waiting lists
- \* Not required to take in a tenant who can not afford the rent for a particular unit
- \* Required to accept Federal, State, or local government rental assistance if the person otherwise qualifies

#### Community Services Block Grants ("CSBG")

- Program is federal in nature and provides funds to alleviate the causes and conditions of poverty in communities
- CSBG funding supports projects that:
  - Lessen poverty in communities
  - \* Address the needs of low-income individuals including the homeless, migrants and the elderly
  - \* Provide services and activities addressing employment, education, better use of available income, housing, nutrition, emergency services and/or health

#### **CSBG – Program Goals and Entities**

- \* CSBG has the following program goals:
  - Increased self-sufficiency
  - Improved living conditions
  - \* Ownership of and pride in their communities
  - Strong family and support systems
- \* Entities provide broad range of services designed to eliminate poverty and foster self-sufficiency
- Eligible entities designated by Governor
- Must provide services in geographic area not served by another eligible entity

#### **CSBG** – Funding

- \* In Texas, TDHCA is the administering agency for CSBG but provides 90% of its funding to eligible subrecipients
- \* The remaining 10% is discretionary in nature and often used as short term, immediate disaster aid
- In FY 16, TDHCA awarded \$28,979,348 in CSBG funds to 41 eligible entities statewide

## HOME Investment Partnerships Program - Tenant-Based Rental Assistance (TBRA)

#### \* Provides:

- > Security and utility deposits
- > Rental subsidies
- Additional funds may be set-aside to extend assistance

#### \* Funding:

\* Approximately \$31 million per year from HUD for several HOME activities, one of which is TBRA

## HOME Investment Partnerships Program – TBRA Administrators

#### \* Administrators:

- > units of general local governments, public housing authorities, nonprofits
- > HOME TBRA is primarily in rural areas

## Section 811 Project-Based Rental (PRA) – Purpose and Funding

#### \* Purpose:

- Provide individualized assistance in project-based rental units
- Persons with disabilities may live as independently as possible

#### \* Funding:


Approximately \$24 million in one-time awards in 2012 and 2013

## Section 811 PRA - Assistance and Locations

- \* Program Design:
  - > Made possible through:
    - TDHCA
    - Texas Health and Human Services Commission,
    - Eligible multifamily properties
    - Local service providers/coordinators
- Locations:
  - > 8 Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs)

# Section 811 PRA – Target Populations

- 1. Persons with disabilities exiting institutions
- 2. Persons with serious mental illness
- 3. Youth or young adults with disabilities exiting Department of Family Protective Services' foster care.

# Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers – Administration, Funding and Design

#### \* Administration:

- Administered by Public Housing Authorities
- TDHCA is one of almost 400 public housing authorities in Texas

#### \* TDHCA Section 8 Funding:

- > Approximately \$10 million annually
- Program Design:
  - > Rent paid by household
  - > Total rent paid to owner

# Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers – Responsibilities and Qualifications

- \* Household responsibilities:
  - > Find a suitable housing unit
  - Owner must agree to rent under program
- \* Unit qualifications:
  - > Must meet health and safety minimum standards

#### **TDHCA Project Access**

- Program Design:
  - > TDHCA Section 8 Housing Choice Vouchers
  - Assist low-income persons with disabilities transition from institutions into community

## TDHCA Project Access – Assistance and Referrals

- \* Eligible persons/households:
  - > Transitioning from:
    - Nursing facilities
    - Intermediate Care Facilities for Individuals with Intellectual Disabilities (ICF/IIDs)
    - State psychiatric hospitals
- \* Referrals:
  - > HHSC's Relocation Contractors

#### Support for Housing: Comprehensive Energy Assistance Program

#### \* Utility Assistance:

- > Payments for gas, electric, and propane
- In certain circumstances, payments for reconnection fees and deposits

#### \* Funding:

- > Approximately \$106 million per year
