

The Housing Inventory Count: Which Projects Are Included?

The Housing Inventory Count (HIC) is a report that informs the homeless assistance community on the **capacity** to house persons who are homeless at local and statewide levels.



What to include on the HIC:

- 1. The **primary** intent of the project is to serve literally homeless persons,
- 2. The project verifies homeless status as part of its eligibility determination, and
- 3. The actual project clients are predominantly homeless (or, for permanent housing, were homeless at entry).

Emergency Shelter (ES):

 HUD considers extreme weather shelters as dedicated homeless inventory

Transitional Housing (TH)

Permanent Housing (PH)

- Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH)
- Rapid Re-housing (RRH)

What not to include on the HIC:

Beds in institutional settings **not specifically dedicated** for persons who are homeless:

- Detox facilities
- 2) Sober living facilities
- 3) Hospitals, Emergency rooms, Inpatient beds
- 4) Iails
- 5) Acute crisis or treatment centers
- 6) Boarding/Care Facilities
- 7) Youth facilities dedicated to children in foster care or the juvenile justice system
