From 2009-2011 I served as chairman of the Coalition to End Homelessness in Oklahoma City. As chairman, I was responsible for leading and convening coalition meetings with 70 local providers. As such, I worked closely with the OKC CoC to ensure coalition meetings met federal funding requirements and expectations.
