

THN has begun our recruitment for the Independent Review Team (IRT) for the 2021 CoC Program competition. We are seeking direct service providers (case managers, intake workers,



There will be two public comment periods: April 15 - May 5 and May 13 - June 2.

In July, THN will host an online Community Planning Session that will give communities an opportunity to create their own Local Action Plans based on the TX BoS CoC Strategic Plan. Watch for updates on how to participate!

The plan will be presented to the TX BoS CoC Board for approval in September.

HUD Releases 2020 Annual Homeless Assessment Report Part 1

"The report found that between 2019 and 2020, homelessness increased significantly among unsheltered populations and people experiencing chronic homelessness. Veteran homelessness did not decrease compared with 2019, and homelessness among family households did not decrease for the first time since 2010. The report also found that people of color are significantly over-represented among people experiencing homelessness."
