# **CoC Governance Charter Review**

Round 3 of public comment is open for the annual CoC Governance Charter review. Check out the proposed revisions to the charter on the CoC's <u>Public Comment portal</u>, and submit your comments by **12/9/2020**. In January the CoC Board will consider approving the proposed changes.

A public comment period allows stakeholders within the TX BoS CoC to review proposed changes to items such as policies or standards and provide input on those changes and potential impacts of the changes. Stakeholders are any persons who live or work in the CoC's geographic area and have an interest in preventing and ending homelessness.

# **Barriers Fund Application Training**

The Texas Balance of State CoC will offer a training webinar for prospective applicants interested in applying for the Barriers Fund Program. The training will provide information on how to submit an application for the Barriers Fund using SurveyMonkey Apply, including application and registration processes, eligibility



criteria and program requirements, and the post-submission review process.

The training will be held on **December 30, 2020 from 11:00 AM CST – 12:30 PM CST.** Any 501(c)3 agency located in the Texas Balance of State Continuum of Care (TX BoS CoC) that has been in operation for at least two years and is interested in applying for the Barriers Fund Program is encouraged to attend.

# **Abilene Ends Chronic Homelessness!**

Abilene, TX, joins an elite group of four communities in the country that have been recognized for reaching functional zero for chronic homelessness, making long-term homelessness rare. Functional Zero for chronic homelessness indicates that Abilene has achieved a gold standard system of support that helps the most vulnerable members of the community exit homelessness. To achieve this certification, the number of households experiencing chronic homelessness in the community must remain at three or below for at least three months, a reality that Abilene has maintained since November 2019. Abilene will now focus on working toward solving youth and family homelessness.

# Funding for Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) Program

The FY 2022 SSVF NOFA has been published in the Federal Register. The NOFA is open to existing SSVF grantees only, including the opportunity for current shallow subsidy grants to extend to September 30, 2023. As the COVID-19 crisis has significantly impacted grantee operations, and supplemental CARES Act funding is expected to support operations well into FY 2022, the Program Office has sought to ensure service continuity and reduce grantee burden. An online training and the Exhibit I-III template is available <a href="here">here</a>. The due date for submissions is February 5, 2021, at 3:00 P.M. CST.

Submissions have been simplified, only requiring Letters of Intent, budget, and CoC distribution (Exhibit I-III), and proof of accreditation, when indicated. No application or letters of support are required, so SSVF Grantees will not need to contact the TX BoS CoC to receive a letter of support.

# Staff Recommendations

The following are resources TX BoS CoC Lead Agency staff at THN believe would be beneficial to your efforts to make homelessness rare, brief, and one-time:



This month's recommendation comes from our Assistant Director of Engagement, Mary Rychlik Stahlke.

Several national reports are released every year that describe the state of homelessness and housing in the U.S. Each has its own focus, but together, they help us see the bigger picture and understand why in many communities, very little affordable housing is available to people experiencing homelessness. The reports can help you to inform community members and elected officials and to advocate for positive changes. The Joint Center for Housing Studies of Harvard University recently published "The State of the Nation's Housing 2020." The report's webpage has pertinent infographics related to

homelessness, housing cost burden, and financial impacts of COVID-19 on renters and homeowners, as well as fact sheets and data sources.

#### Other reports:

- The National Low Income Housing Coalition's "Out of Reach 2020" report gives
  data about the high cost of housing. Texas ranks 21st most expensive, with a
  housing wage for a two-bedroom at Fair Market Rent (FMR) of \$20.90, meaning a
  household would need to make \$43,478 per year to afford a two-bedroom unit at
  FMR, which equates to 2.9 full-time jobs at minimum wage (Mini Report, page 20).
- National Alliance to End Homelessness's <u>"The State of Homelessness 2020"</u> report gives data on demographics, trends, state-level statistics, and assistance available.
