Community Resiliency Program (CRP)

The Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) is pleased to announce the release of a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) of \$38 million in Community Development Block Grant CARES Act (CDBG-CV) funds for the Community Resiliency Program (CRP).



The CRP allows for non-entitlement cities and counties to create, expand, or enhance public facilities that provide medical care, social services, and/or non-congregate housing and increase the community's long-term resiliency and ability to mitigate current and future coronavirus outbreaks. Further, because few rural and small metro areas have had the opportunity to implement mobile response units or emergency medical services that would have a positive impact on their capability to reach certain households, CRP funds allow for the purchase of equipment to increase capacity to carry out a public service which meets CDBG-CV eligibility.

All CRP applications must be submitted by 5 p.m., Austin local time, on Tuesday, November 30. 2021.

Child Tax Credit Available to Families

The Child Tax Credit is a tax benefit to help families who are raising children. The <u>Child Tax Credit in the American</u> <u>Rescue Plan</u> provides the largest child tax credit ever and historic relief to most working families. The Internal Revenue

Service (IRS) will pay half the total credit amount in advance monthly payments (\$300/month/child for each child under age 6, and \$250/month/child for each child ages 6 to 17) beginning in July 2021. Families will claim the other half when they file their 2021 income tax return.

2022 Health Insurance Marketplace Open Enrollment



The 2022 Marketplace is now open! Due to the COVID relief law passed earlier this year, many people who buy health insurance through the Marketplace are now eligible for more savings and lower monthly premiums.

In fact, 4 out of 5 who enroll in a health plan through <u>HealthCare.gov</u> can find a plan for \$10 or less per month, with financial assistance. Find out if you're eligible for additional savings by visiting <u>HealthCare.gov</u> today to update your information for 2022, review your health coverage options, and enroll in a plan that best fits your needs.

There's more than one way to enroll in Marketplace coverage. If you would like assistance from an agent or broker or would like to enroll through one of our certified enrollment partners, you can learn more here.

If you enroll by December 15, your coverage can begin January 1, 2022.
