- TX BoS CoC HMIS Lead Agency and Coordinated Entry Lead Agency




#### What is a CoC?

A CoC, as defined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in the CoC Program Interim Rule at 24 CFR Part 578.3, is the group organized to carry out the responsibilities required under the CoC Program for a defined geographic area.

#### **Mission Statement**

The TX BoS CoC develops systemlevel responses and coordinates local community strategies that prevent and end homelessness and increase housing stability.

#### **HUD's definition of "Homeless"**

- Residing in a place not meant for human habitation
- Residing in temporary shelter
  - Congregate/emergency shelter
  - Transitional housing
  - Hotel/motel paid by charity or federal/state/local government
- Fleeing domestic violence



### **Ending Homelessness**

Every community has a systemic response in place that ensures homelessness is prevented whenever possible or is otherwise a rare, brief, and non-recurring experience.

#### **Governance Charter Overview**

- Charter identifies the CoC's governance structure, roles, responsibilities, and authority
- Outlines key operational components of the CoC
- Links to CoC policies and procedures
- General members, CoC Board members, and THN staff may suggest changes throughout the year
- Staff will give public notice about the suggested changes and make them available for public comment
- CoC Board approves changes on behalf of the CoC

### **Process to Select CoC Board Members**

- Written process must be voted on at least every 5 years
- Process:
  - THN staff solicit nominations from CoC general membership for seats that are up for election
  - People nominate themselves using the nomination form
  - Nominations may be accepted by the current CoC Board members or put out for a vote by the CoC general membership
  - If CoC general members vote, the nominees receiving the most votes will be elected to their respective seats

### **TX BoS CoC Staffing Enhancements**

- In August, Texas Homeless Network (THN) created and filled the role of Senior Director of CoC Programs
- This new role represents a shift in the internal structure and oversight provided to THN's Texas Balance of State CoC teams
- Goal to facilitate and finalize internal transitions by the end of October

Stronger connections to communities and General Members, reinvigorating relationships postpandemic


Implementation of system-wide strategies to advance the performance and operations of the CoC
