Welcome (Stephanie)	Meeting called to order at 3:04 PM by Chair, Stephanie. Quorum was met. Stephanie welcomed back Audra Rea and welcomed new member, Toni Johnson (who did not attend the meeting).

2026 CoC Action Plan (Hope)	Staff presented the Board Action Request (BAR) to consider approving extending the CoC's 2026 Action Plan by 12 months, therefore converting it to a two-year Action Plan. Following the presentation, no questions or discussion occurred. Victor moved to approve extending the 2026-27 CoC Action Plan, as presented, and Stephanie seconded the motion. Members voted. The motion passed.	Motion passed.
Data Reports Submitted to HUD (Mary)	Staff delivered a presentation on data reports submitted to HUD, including the Longitudinal Systems Analysis (LSA) and System Performance Measures (SPMs). Key	

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	points included: • LSA: A year-to-year reduction in the number of data quality flags associated with these reports, where FY25 contained 57 flags, in comparison to 110 in FY22. • SPMs: Positive and negative year-to-year changes by System Performance Measure, the corresponding system trend, and relevant context for changes Following the presentation, staff invited questions from members. • Daisy asked if these reports include information collected by Victim Service Providers utilizing Comparable Databases. Cosme and Lindsay confirmed that these reports only include data entered in the CoC's HMIS, which doesn't include data collected in Comparable Databases. Hope shared that this is a gap recently identified in terms of local-level data sharing in connection to the CoC's Action Plan, and that staff are coordinating internally to understand options to supplement HMIS data with data from VSPs while still meeting all privacy and confidentiality considerations.	
CoC Program (Billy)	Staff provided an update on the CoC Program NOFOs as outlined below. • CoC Program FY26 Annual NOFO ○ NAEH filed a lawsuit, but Collaborative Applicant (THN) staff will continue to move forward with the existing competition timeline as planned, until further action occurs. Applicants were notified of the lawsuit and THN's intent to continue with the existing local deadlines. ○ The TX BoS CoC Local Competition opened June 12 and will close at 5pm on July 7th. There are 21 new project applications including 30-40 counties that aren't covered by CoC Program funding. Two renewal projects have elected to voluntarily reallocate their funds; staff will send a corresponding BAR and Action Without a Meeting when appropriate. ○ The Board will select a ranking scenario by 2pm on 8/10, which becomes the Priority Listing. ○ CoC Infrastructure, PSH projects, and high-scoring RRH and TH/RRH projects will be in Tier 1. Tier 2 will include transition applications and new CoC Bonus and DV Bonus project applications.

CoC Modernization (Hope)	Staff provided members with an overview of CoC Modernization work completed to date, including: - The formation of the CoC Modernization workgroup and a corresponding topic-focused workplan, and the corresponding recommendations and actions completed as a result of this work, such as exploring peer-sharing opportunities and improving accessibility of resources. - Short-term goals around continued planning and coordination with HUD TA to support data-driving decision making within local communities and in CoC operations. - Long term goals on working with Local Homeless Coalitions to develop local action plans. - A reminder that CoC Modernization activities are now embedded into the CoC's Action Plans and that a final CoC Modernization Written Report will be distributed when available - A Master of Social Work intern will be starting at THN in August to support this work.	Staff will continue working on CoC modernization activities.
Board Member Suggestions (Victor)	Victor reminded members that the Texas Conference on Ending Homelessness will be held in Houston from 9/23/26 to 9/25/2026, including a hybrid CoC Board meeting on 9/22, followed by a dinner.
